First Aid

Level 3 Award Emergency Paediatric First Aid (RQF)

This qualification is designed for learners with a responsibility for the care of children and babies. The purpose of the qualification is for the learner to attain the knowledge and skills required to deal with a range of paediatric first aid conditions and incidents.

Ofsted and the Early Years Foundation Stage

This one-day course **does not** meet the Ofsted requirements for people working with children at a professional level. This is unit 1 of the 2 day Paediatric First Aid course.

Mandatory Units

- Unit 1 Emergency Paediatric First Aid

Duration

A Total Qualification Time of 7 hours with at least 6 hours tutor contact, 1 day classroom based learning, consisting of practical and theoretical activities.

How is the qualification assessed?

The tutor will carry out ongoing assessment throughout the course, with a written assessment to complete the course. A Three-year Emergency Paediatric First Aid RQF award will be issued subject to successful completion and assessment.

Syllabus

A range of subjects are covered including: -

- Role of the Paediatric 1st Aider
- Seizure
- Wounds, bleeding. And shock (including Anaphylaxis)
- Primary Survey
- Choking
- Recovery Position
- Resuscitation and AED awareness
- Minor Injuries

Numbers

Due to the practical nature of this course, a minimum of 4 candidates are required with a maximum of 12 candidates. Minimum age of 14 years, although a student cannot assume responsibility for first aid until they attain the age of 16 years

Candidates might like to expand their knowledge and take the Paediatric First Aid course, or the 3 day First Aid at Work course
