

Course Fact Sheet

First Aid

Award in Basic Life support and Safe Use of Automatic External Defibrillator.

The objective of this award is to give candidates practical experience and knowledge for dealing with emergency cardiac events.

This is ideal for an appointed person in the workplace, where a fully qualified First Aider is not required by the First Aid Risk Assessment.

Mandatory Units

- Unit 1 BLS and AED

Duration

A minimum of 4 hours tutor contact, consisting of practical and theoretical activities.

How is the qualification assessed?

The tutor will carry out ongoing assessment throughout the course, with a written assessment on completion of the session.

A *1st Line Training* Certificate is issued on successful completion of this course. Valid for 3 years, it is recommended that candidates update their knowledge annually.

Syllabus

A range of subjects are covered including: -

- Resuscitation and AED awareness
- Heart attacks
- Anaphylaxis
- Stroke

Numbers

Due to the practical nature of this course, a minimum of 4 candidates are required with a maximum of 12 candidates.

Minimum age of 14 years, although a student cannot assume responsibility for first aid until they attain the age of 16 years
